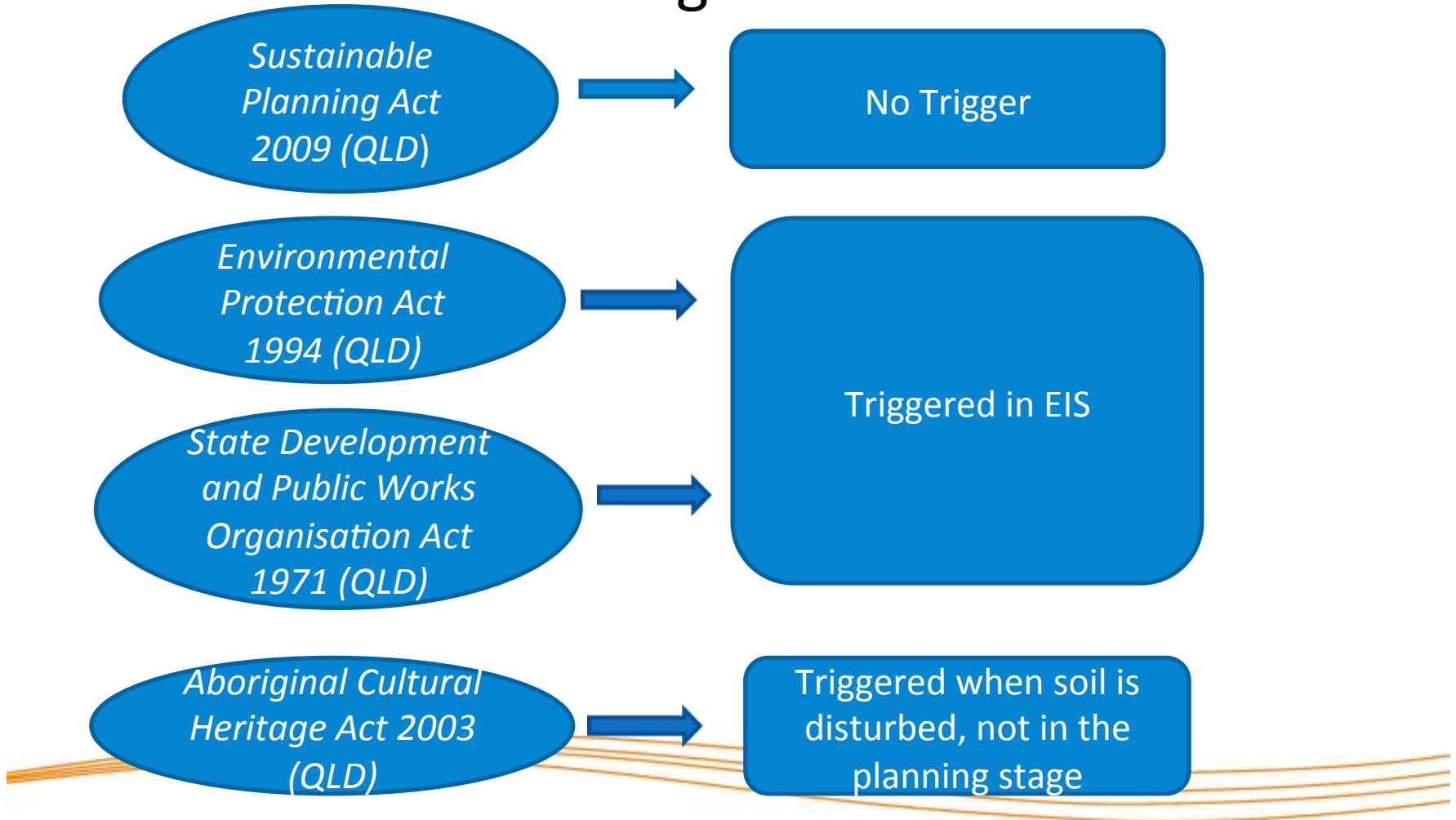

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Triggers in Legislation



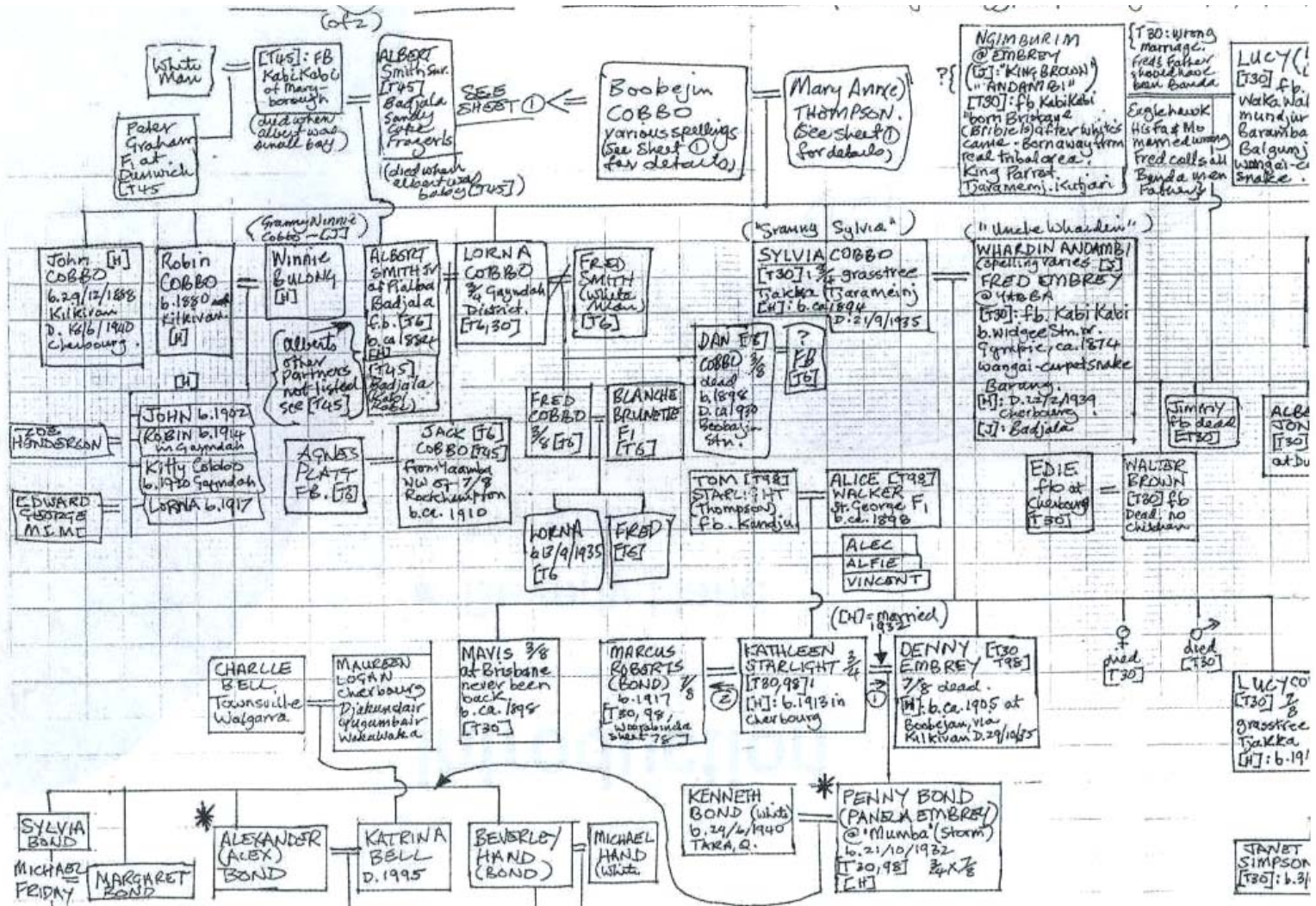
Under the current law, who can speak for Country?
