
Exploring new trends in environmental law and governance - Earth Jurisprudence and Rights of Nature

Earth Jurisprudence, or Earth Laws, is a new legal theory and growing social movement. It proposes that we rethink our legal, political, economic and governance systems so that they support, rather than undermine, the integrity and health of the Earth. Earth Laws stress human interconnectedness and dependence with the natural world and seeks to catalyse a shift in law from human-centeredness to a recognition of our interconnectedness with nature.

The purpose of this workshop is to provide an introduction to Earth Jurisprudence and examine its meaning in the Northern Territory context. The workshop will be highly interactive and will include the following topics:

- An introduction to elements of Earth jurisprudence including Rights of Nature, living within our ecological limits and cross-cultural perspectives
- Indigenous perspectives of environmental law and management
- A panel discussion about how the Territory's environmental laws compare to other Australian jurisdictions (Qld, NSW, Victoria)
