Earth Laws, or Earth Jurisprudence, is a new legal theory and growing social movement. It proposes that we rethink our legal, political, economic and governance systems so that they support, rather than undermine, the integrity and health of the Earth. Earth Jurisprudence stresses human interconnectedness and dependence with the natural world and seeks to catalyse a shift in law from human-centeredness to a recognition of our interconnectedness with nature.

The workshop will be highly interactive and include:

- An introduction to elements of Earth Laws including Rights of Nature, and an overview of the international and national movements advocating for Earth centred law and governance;
- Discussions about the relevance of Earth Jurisprudence in the Northern Territory, with a focus on planning and development laws and indigenous perspectives of environmental management.
