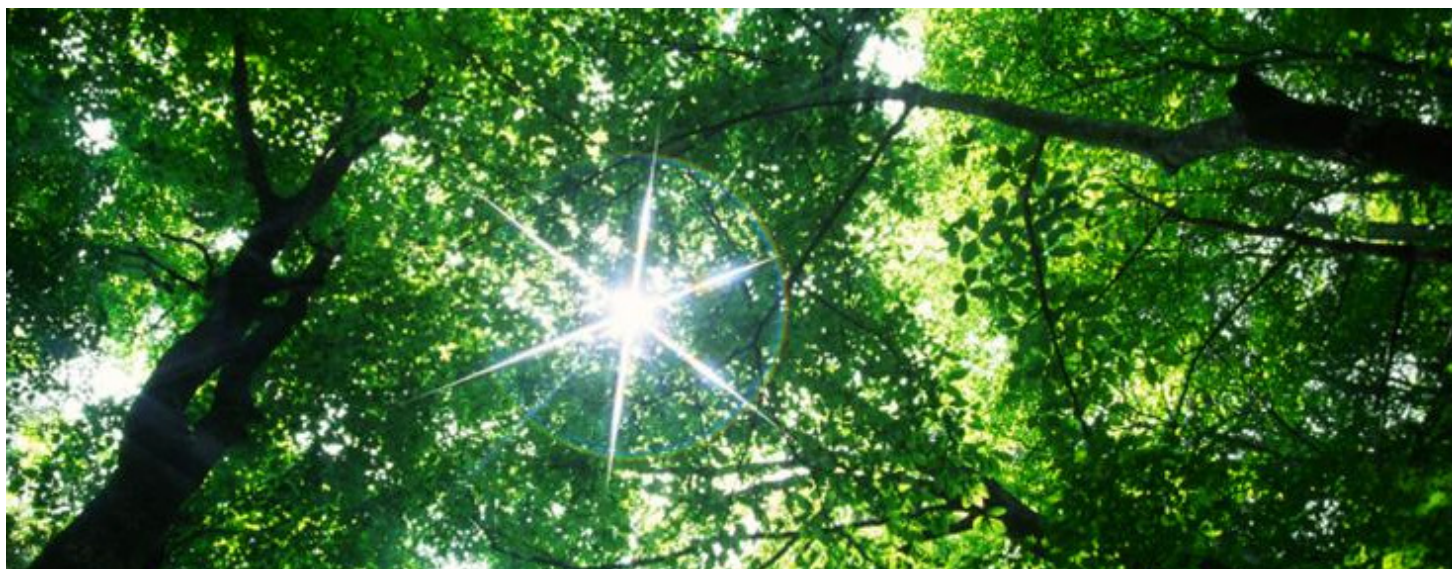


Nurturing a Spiritual Approach to Climate Change
